

## **The Dewey Plan-It's Not Easy<sup>1</sup>**

Delaware requires every town to draft and obtain the legislature's approval of a long-range plan for its development. The task here is in the hands of our Planning & Zoning Commission led by its capable chair, Harry Wilson, and manned by his corps of willing volunteer members.

At press time they had discussed forward-looking possible residential zoning ideas at a late-night workshop session in mid-August and scheduled another for September 11. Held at the Lifesaving Station, these meetings are public. Minutes are promptly available at the Town Hall.

While there is no way to predict finalization of Dewey's plan, it's the aim of the Commission to present its draft early this fall for approval by the Town Council. That would allow the legislature to sign off on it this winter. With all of the municipal plans at hand, the State legislature and administration can more easily identify their own roles as our population grows.
